McGee uses stories, good questions and Scripture to break down these lies and reveal the truth.
How long did it take to go through the resource?	9 weeks, we did one chapter a week
How much prep time is needed if meeting for group discussion?	1/2 hour to read the chapter and do the "homework"
Things I enjoyed:	I loved the topics of the chapters and the homework at the end which got us more deeply into Scripture.
Things I didn't enjoy:	Toward the end it started to feel a bit repetitive, I suggest reading ahead and combining a few chapters so that the overall study is not so long.
Would you recommend this resource? Why or why not?	I would definitely recommend this youth small group book to high school groups, I think 10th or 11th grade is best.
What was the most important thing you learned?	The girls in my group and I were hit hardest by how we have bought into the lie that how well we "perform" at sports, in academics or other activities determines how valuable we are to others and to God. We learned to recognize this lie and place our value only in Jesus Christ.
